Definitions of a credit hour

Credit hours at St. John's are defined as follows:

- Theory is calculated at a 1:1 ratio; 1 clock hour per week for 15 weeks equals one credit hour.
- Lab is calculated at a 2:1 ratio; 2 clock hours per week for 15 weeks equal one credit hour.
- Clinical is calculated at a 3:1 ratio; 3 clock hours per week for 15 weeks equals one credit hour.

Immunization policy

In accordance with Illinois Law (Public Act) 85-1315 and St. John's College clinical agency agreements all students enrolled at St. John's College, Department of Nursing are required to provide proof of immunity. All students entering the Nursing Program are expected to be in compliance with all Health Requirements. These requirements include, but are not limited to the following: immunizations, a health physical evaluation, blood titers, TB screening, annual flu vaccine, work test, fit test and drug test. Those students not in compliance with these requirements by the specified timeframes are prevented from attending theory courses and/or clinical placements until deficiencies are completed.

Health/accident insurance

All students are required to be protected by health insurance. Proof of current coverage must be submitted annually. Those students not in compliance with these requirements by the specified timeframes are prevented from attending clinical placements.
